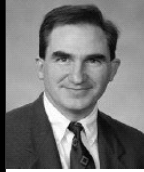

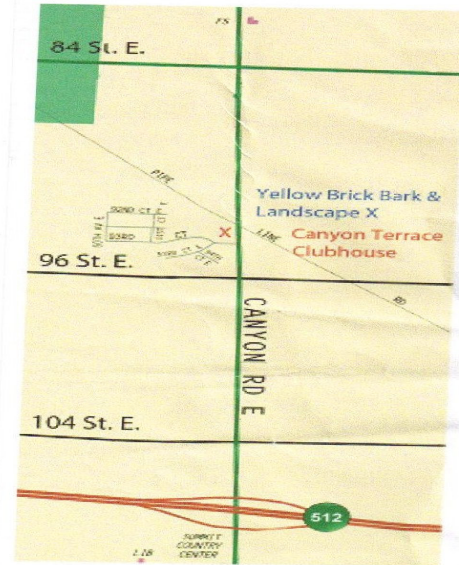

TRIBUTE TO DAWN

Dawn Morrell distinguished herself in the legislature, much like she has distinguished herself in the Puyallup community. In 2001, when the 25th District needed someone to step forward and run for the House of Representatives, Dawn volunteered. When I first met her, she was a serious candidate, as you might expect from someone who knew her way around a hospital emergency room. But she didn't take herself too seriously, and showed that by her occasional humor and unusually frank discussions. She knew it would be tough to get elected, but to her, it was doable and important.

After she was elected, Dawn approached her work in the Legislature in the same manner. She was well versed in her issues, especially her passion: health care. In fact, the new Good Samaritan Hospital cardiac unit would not be built but for specific legislation she spearheaded. I still remember receiving a phone call from her one evening after she had finished one of her shifts. She told me of residents in our community who were denied necessary cardiac services due to obsolete state regulations. "We have to do something" she said convincingly. I was sold.

It also didn't take long for Dawn's colleagues to come to trust her judgment and leadership. When the Caucus Chair from Walla Walla, Representative Bill Grant, died unexpectedly in 2009, it was hard to find a replacement. "Who could be trusted by the different factions within the House democratic caucus?" legislators asked. Dawn was approached, or "drafted," by a number of her colleagues to run for the position, including Speaker Frank Chopp. I vaguely remember Dawn being hesitant about running for the position -- "why would I want to do that?" she questioned. "I want to stay focused on healthcare." But it didn't take long for her to realize that the House, and the state, would be better off with her in that position.

Through some of the most difficult budget times in our state's history, Dawn served as the House Caucus Chair for the 2009 and 2010 sessions. Her accomplishments are many --from transportation projects for this area, to civil rights for its citizens, to well-deserved benefits for our veterans, Dawn was steadfast and driven.

For eight years we were all lucky and blessed to call Dawn our Representative. We are still lucky and blessed to have her as part of our community.

25th LD DECEMBER 2nd REORGANIZATION MINUTES

The following elections for the Chair, Vice-Chair, State Committee Woman, State Committee Man, 1st County Committee Member, 2nd County Committee Member and 3rd County Committee Member are all voted on by the Elected PCO's for the 25th District. Also 2 out of the 3 County Committee Members must be PCO's. There were 12 PCO's who attended the meeting.

Louis Tibbs was elected Chair by a unanimous vote of 12-0.

Luanne Green was elected Vice-Chair by a unanimous vote of 12-0.

Ellen Zuluaf was elected State Committee Woman by a unanimous vote of 12-0.

Cliff Allo was elected State Committee Man by a unanimous vote of 12-0.

Eric Herde was elected 1st County Committee Member by a unanimous vote of 12-0.

There was a contested race for 2nd County Committee Member Melissa Thompson won with 9 votes against Challenger Merv Swanson with 3 votes.

Merv Swanson was elected 3rd County Committee Member by a unanimous vote of 12-0.

We called the 25th Legislative District Meeting to order, we then had the Flag Salute. Then Chair Louis Tibbs appointed Cliff Allo as Parliamentarian. Then we had elections for Treasurer, Secretary, Membership Officer, and Sergeant at Arms which were voted on by PCOs and Dues paying members of the organization.

Al Gray was elected Treasurer with a 21-0 vote with 1 member not voting.

Melissa Thompson was elected Secretary with a 20-0 vote with 2 members not voting.

Ray Green was elected Membership Officer with a 21-0 vote with 1 member not voting.

Eric Renz was elected Sergeant at Arms with a 22-0 vote.

We adopted the Agenda, the minutes, and the Treasurer's Report which were online. We had several Elected Officials which were Senator Jim Kastama and District Court Judge Claire Sussman.

Senator Kastama spoke about the State Budget and we will have to make more cuts and efficiency of some programs. He wasn't sure if there will be a special session. He chairs the Economic Committee and is seeking appointment to the Ways & Means Appropriations committee. He said that Washington State is ranked 2nd in the nation for Innovative Economy. He will try to make it back from session for every LD meeting to give us a legislative update.

Newly elected District Court Judge Claire Sussman thanked the LD for helping her win her election. She talked a little about what kind of cases the District Court handles. She announced that the traffic court will now be held at the City Courthouse.

Cliff Allo talked about the Resolution Process. It must be drafted with stating its cause and using the whereas and therefore be it finally resolved wording. It is then reported to the resolutions committee which will look at it and fixed if any corrections are needed, then it's reported to the LD which then can be adopted by the LD if we believe in the resolution.

Eric Herde wrote a resolution to reduce Unemployment by lowering the retirement age. He wrote this resolution based on facts he got from research and listening to radio show talk host Thom Hartman. He thinks that by lowering the retirement age by 5 years that it will help with the lowering the unemployment nation-wide. We had discussion about the resolution then Charley Stokes came up with a motion to table the resolution and do more research. The motion to table was seconded and passed.

Legislative Send-off Dinner with Congressman Adam Smith as Guest Speaker will be at the Puyallup Elks club on Friday January 7th. Social Hour starts at 6 p.m. with Dinner at 7p.m. This will take place of our January General Membership Meeting.

The night of the monthly meetings will change. February's meeting will be at Al Gray's at the Canyon Terrace Clubhouse 9314 Canyon Rd E, Puyallup, WA 98371 on Tuesday February 1st. Starting in March the meeting will be at the Puyallup Library either the 1st Monday or 1st Tuesday of the Month.

Jerry Beckendorf thanked the people who donated toys or gift cards for the Toy Drive.

The meeting was adjourned at 0845 PM.
